He is also co-author (with Paul A. Erickson) of *A History of Anthropological Theory* (UTP Higher Education, 1998; 2003; 2008) and co-editor (with Paul A. Erickson) of *Readings for a History of Anthropological Theory* (UTP Higher Education, 2001; 2006; 2010). A specialist on religion in Northern Ireland, Murphy is also the author of *Believing in Belfast: Charismatic Christianity After the Troubles* (Carolina Academic Press, 2010).
